#### What to consider when EXPLORING health careers

- WHAT kind of healthcare do I want to provide?
  - ▶ Treat and diagnose, rehabilitate a patient, help with fine motor skills, comfort patients?
  - www.exploreheathcareers.org
- WHERE do I want to provide this healthcare?
  - In a hospital, public health clinic, pharmacy, ER, general practice office, nursing home
  - Can I handle the site of blood, injuries, and trauma?

#### What to consider when EXPLORING health careers

- Do I have a strong scientific aptitude?
  - Biology and lab
  - General Chemistry and lab
  - Organic Chemistry and lab
  - Physics and lab
  - Calculus and statistics
  - English
  - (other health professions may require more pre-reqs: biochemistry, anatomy, physiology, genetics, microbiology)
- ▶ What lifestyle do I envision?
  - ▶ Do I want to be on-call, deal with medical emergencies, and work 60+ hours/week?
  - ► Would I prefer a more balanced lifestyle?
  - ▶ How well do I manage stress?

► How long will it take?

► Am I competitive enough?

GPA	3.5-4.0	3.0-3.5	3.0-3.5 (based on points)	3.2-3.5	3.2- 3.5	3.0 - 3.5

- If I'm NOT competitive enough, do I need additional training prior to applying?
  - ▶ If you have less than a 3.4 GPA, a post-bacc program might benefit you to demonstrate that you will be able to handle the academic rigor
  - ► How long will this take? 1-2 years
  - ► How much will it cost? ~\$25,000/year
- Keep in mind, post baccs are competitive and do not have many spots available
  - Am I willing to leave the state of California where some schools may be less competitive?
- ▶ If you have a 3.0 and above, consider a Master's program in the sciences

- What is the process of licensure?
- It's not over once you take the MCAT or other entrance exam
  - ► There are multiple exams for many of the health professions

- What will the ROI (return on my investment) be?
  - What is the cost-benefit analysis of attending a health professional school?
  - Comparing tuition, living expenses, lost wages to how much you will be making (tuition and salaries vary depending on state)

#### Application Checklist:

- √ Strong overall GPA, science GPA, and test scores
- √ Completion of pre-requisites
- $\sqrt{\ }$  Clinical experience, shadowing a health care professional, patient contact
- √ Research experience (MD)
- $\sqrt{\ }$  Volunteer experience/service for underserved communities
- $\sqrt{\ }$  Demonstration of leadership (serving on a board, committee, student orgs, etc.)
- √ Letters of recommendation
- √ Personal Statement
